Roskilde: Known for its Viking history and the famous Roskilde Festival.

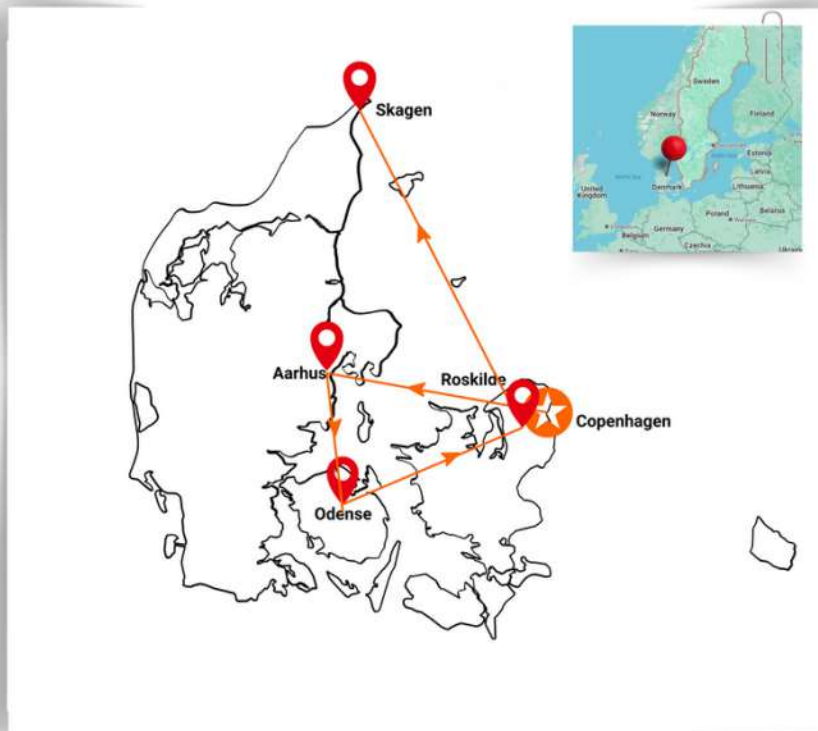
Skagen: A picturesque coastal town known for its unique light and stunning beaches.

8 Day Sample Itinerary of Denmark

Day 1



Arrive in Copenhagen

Day 5



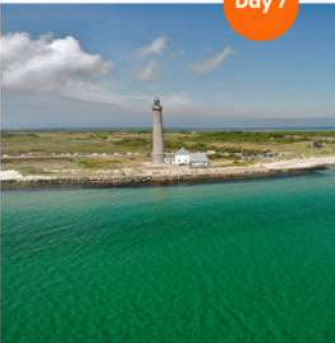
Aarhus to Odense

Odense to Roskilde
