Botswana offers a unique and unforgettable experience, particularly for those interested in wildlife and natural beauty.

Here are some key highlights:

1. Okavango Delta

The Okavango Delta is one of the world's largest inland deltas and a UNESCO World Heritage site. It's a prime location for game viewing, particularly during the dry season (May to October), when animals congregate around the water sources.

2. Chobe National Park

Chobe National Park is famous for its large elephant population, often seen along the Chobe River. A boat cruise on the river offers a unique perspective for wildlife viewing. The park is home to diverse wildlife, including lions, leopards, buffaloes, and various antelope species.

3. Moremi Game Reserve

5. Kalahari Desert

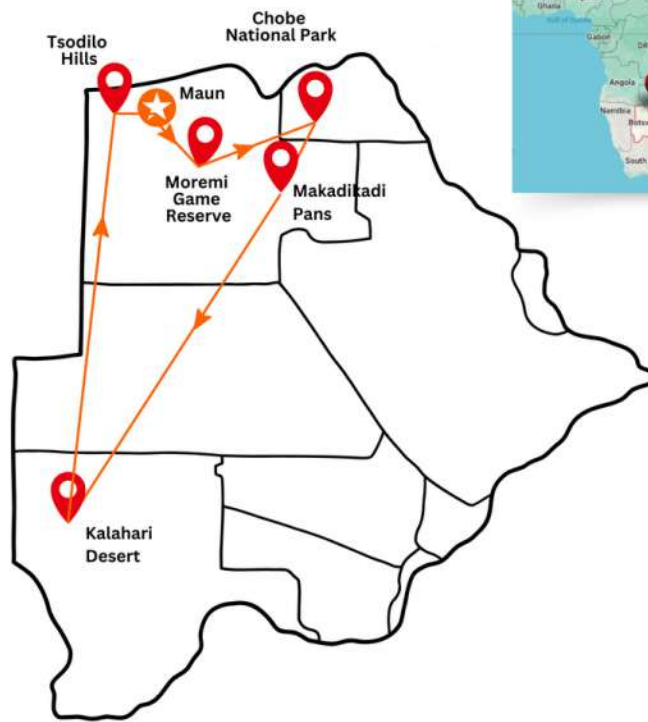

Best time to visit

Dry Season (May to October): This is the peak safari season when wildlife is more concentrated around water sources, making it easier to spot animals.

Green Season (November to March): The landscape is lush and green, with a chance to see newborn animals. It's also a great time for birdwatching, although some areas may be more challenging to access due to rains.

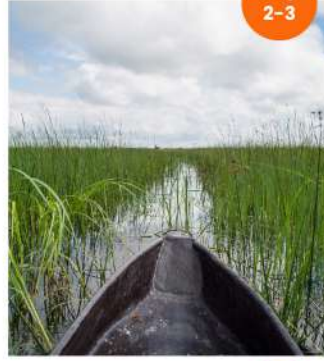

Day 1



Arrival in Maun
Morning:
Arrive in Maun, the gateway to the Okavango Delta.
Check into your accommodation and rest after your journey.
Afternoon:
Explore Maun: Visit the local markets and learn about the culture and traditions of Botswana.
Optional scenic flight over the Okavango Delta for a bird's-eye view of this incredible ecosystem.

Day 2-3



Okavango Delta
Morning:
Transfer to your camp in the Okavango Delta, either by small plane or 4x4 vehicle.
Settle into your camp and enjoy the surroundings.
Afternoon/Evening:
Begin your safari with a mokoro (dugout canoe) excursion through the delta's waterways.
Evening game drive to spot nocturnal animals.

Day 3



Full day of safari activities, including game drives and walking safaris.
Enjoy a sundowner in the wilderness as you watch the sunset over the delta.

Day 4-5



Moremi Game Reserve
Morning:
Depart for Moremi Game Reserve, a top destination for wildlife viewing.
Check into your lodge or camp.
Afternoon:
Embark on a game drive to spot lions, leopards, elephants, and more.

Day 5



Full day of game viewing in Moremi, with both morning and afternoon drives.
Optional boat cruise in the reserve's lagoons and channels.

Day 6-7



Chobe National Park
Morning:
Fly or drive to Chobe National Park, known for its dense elephant population.
Check into a lodge near the Chobe River.
Afternoon:
Afternoon game drive along the riverfront, where you can see large herds of elephants, buffalo, and other wildlife.

Day 7



Morning game drive in Chobe National Park.
Afternoon boat cruise on the Chobe River for close-up views of hippos, crocodiles, and elephants swimming.

Day 8



Makgadikgadi Pans
Morning:
Transfer to the Makgadikgadi Pans, one of the largest salt flats in the world.

Optional quad biking experience on the pans.

Day 9



Kalahari Desert
Morning:
Travel to the Central Kalahari Game Reserve.
Check into your accommodation, often in a remote and pristine part of the desert.
Afternoon:
Game drive to see the unique wildlife of the Kalahari, including the black-maned Kalahari lions. Visit a local San community to learn about their culture and survival skills.

Day 10



Tsodilo Hills & Return to Maun
Morning:
Depart for Tsodilo Hills, a UNESCO World Heritage site with ancient rock paintings.
Explore the site with a guide to understand its cultural and spiritual significance.
Afternoon:
Return to Maun for your departure or onward travel.
Optional evening in Maun for last-minute shopping or relaxation.
