Odense to Roskilde
Morning: Travel to Roskilde
(approximately 1.5 hours by train).
Afternoon: Visit the Viking Ship Museum
and explore Roskilde Cathedral, a
UNESCO World Heritage site.
Evening: Take a leisurely walk around
the city center and enjoy dinner at a

local café.



Roskilde to Skagen Morning: Travel to Skagen (approximately 4 hours by train, with a possible transfer).

Afternoon: Visit the Skagen Museum and explore the beautiful beaches at Grenen, where the North Sea and Baltic Sea

Evening: Enjoy fresh seafood at a local restaurant and watch the sunset over the beach.



Skagen to Copenhagen
Morning: Return to Copenhagen
(approximately 4.5 hours by train).
Afternoon: Spend your last afternoon
shopping or visiting any remaining sites,
such as The Round Tower or Strøget, the
pedestrian shopping street.
Evening: Depart from Copenhagen or
enjoy a farewell dinner in the city.
