3. Kruger National Park

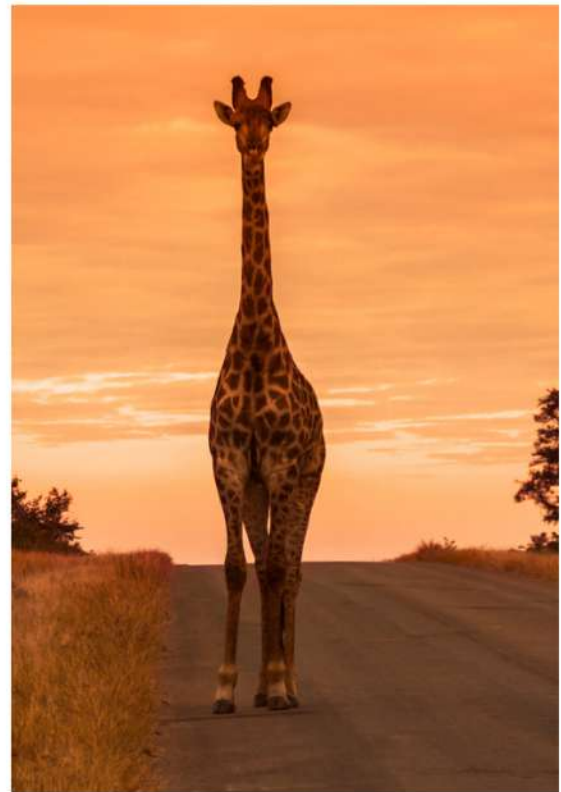

Day 1



Arrival in Cape Town
