Day 1

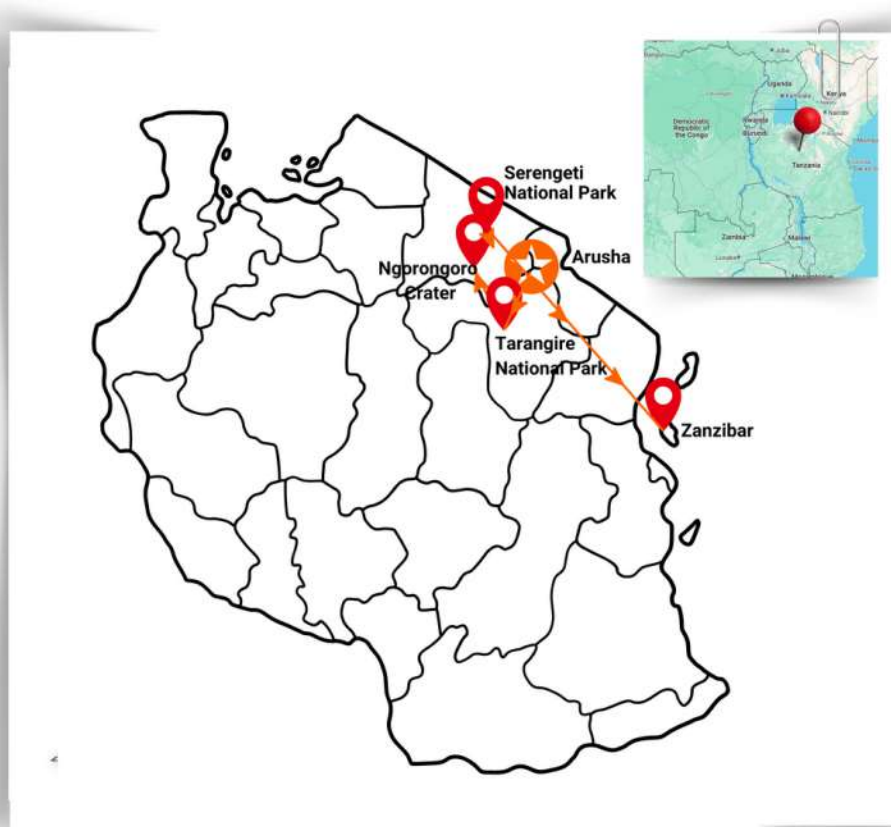

The Great Migration is one of the most spectacular wildlife events in the world, occurring annually as millions of wildebeest, zebras, and gazelles traverse the Serengeti-Masai Mara ecosystem. Viewing the Great Migration in Tanzania offers a chance to witness this incredible phenomenon up close.

Timing and Locations for Viewing

1. Timing of the Migration

Calving Season (January to March): The migration begins with calving in the southern Serengeti. This is a great time to see newborn wildebeest and witness predators taking advantage of the vulnerable young.

The Great Migration (April to June): As the rains end, the herds move north towards the central Serengeti and then into the western Serengeti.

River Crossings (July to October): The herds reach the Mara River, where dramatic river crossings occur as they attempt to cross into Kenya's Masai Mara. This is one of the most iconic and photographed aspects of the migration.

Return to the Serengeti (November to December): The herds begin their return journey south as the rains start again, completing the migration cycle.

2. Best Viewing Areas in Tanzania

Southern Serengeti: Ideal for witnessing the calving season. Areas like Ndutu and the southern plains offer excellent game viewing during this period.

Central Serengeti: As the herds move north, central Serengeti remains a prime location for spotting large herds and predators.

Western Serengeti: Best visited from May to June, offering great opportunities to see the herds in lush green landscapes.

Mara River: The dramatic river crossings happen around the Mara River in the northern Serengeti. This is a prime viewing location from July to October.
